Federal Employees', Longshore and Harbor Workers' Compensation

Federal Employees' Workers' Compensation Program

The Division of Federal Employees' Compensation adjudicates new claims for benefits, manages ongoing cases, pays medical expenses and compensation benefits to injured workers and survivors, and helps injured employees return to work when they are medically able to do so.

Covered individuals:

- A civil officer or employee in a branch of the Government of the United States, including an officer or employee of an instrumentality wholly owned by the United States
- An individual rendering personal service to the United States similar to the service of a civil officer or employee of the United States, without pay or for nominal pay, when a statute authorizes the acceptance or use of the service, or authorizes payment of travel or other expenses of the individual
- An individual, other than an independent contractor or an individual employed by an independent contractor, employed on the Menominee Indian Reservation in Wisconsin in operations conducted under a statute relating to tribal timber and logging operations on that reservation
- An individual employed by the government of the District of Columbia
- An individual appointment to a position on the office staff of a former President under section 1(b) of the Act of August 25, 1958
- An individual selected pursuant to Chapter 121 of title 28, United States Code and serving as a petit or grand juror

Longshore and Harbor Workers Compensation Program

The mission of the Longshore Program is to minimize the impact of land based, maritime employment injuries and deaths on the injured employees and their families by ensuring that workers' compensation benefits are provided promptly and properly under the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Compensation Act (LHWCA), Defense Base Act (DBA), Non-Appropriated Fund Instrumentalities Act and the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act.



Covered individuals

- Employers who employ workers for maritime work or in a maritime occupation, either full or part-time, on the navigable waters of the United States or in adjoining waterfront areas
- Employees engaged in maritime work or in maritime occupation including a longshoreman or other person in long-shoring operation, and any harbor worker, including a ship-repairman, ship-builder and ship-breaker
- Other employees covered through the Defense Base Act, Outer Continental Shelf lands Act and Non-appropriated Fund Instrumentalities Act
